

KEEPING OUR PROMISE

As a new Chief Executive Officer at the Trenton YMCA in 2011, I was excited to be part of such a great organization and community. The opportunity to impact our youth, adults and seniors by building an environment and culture that would support a healthier community was very energizing to me.

From the very beginning of my tenure as the CEO, there was a realization that the organization was offering needed programs and

services, but the physical infrastructure was in great need of repairs and limiting in its usability. The Y promised its members and community that it would make improvements and ensure that there was access to quality facilities in the City of Trenton, as there had been in days past when located on East State Street.

In early 2015 we were offered a great opportunity from our community partner Wells Fargo to expand the Y's footprint. The shopping center

branch that Wells Fargo closed in 2011 had been dormant since that point. Working in partnership with Wells Fargo we had a vision of how to improve the space and create greater community benefit. Because of this partnership, we officially cut the ribbon on 4,000 square feet of new space located at 359 Pennington Ave. This space now houses our C-suite offices, the County's largest dance academy, group exercise space and provides meeting space for the community.

As we completed renovating the space at 359 Pennington Avenue, the Y purchased the land separating the 431 Pennington Avenue site and the 359 Pennington Avenue site for future expansion of its parking lot from 32 cars to 82 cars. June 19, 2015 the Trenton Y began renovating the main building at 431 Pennington Avenue. The input from members and the community was invaluable in developing a plan that would allow the Y to be of more impactful service. We listened to the feedback from our members and community and took steps



to replace the basketball court, provide new locker rooms and showers, relocate and update the space for our Pre-School children. Totally redesigning the buildings layout including the location of the front door with respect to the parking lot has impacted the organizations functionality in a positive way.

We kept our promise to you and have provided the Trenton, Ewing and Lawrence communities

with an amazing new facility in a building that was built in 1940 as a supermarket. The board of trustees and I are committed to making a meaningful difference in the community. We want to improve the quality of life and help the community to live a healthy lifestyle while providing an alternative for our youth on afterschool safe havens.


